#### THE ACADEMIC BREAKFAST CLUB – PEER MENTORSHIP AS A MODEL FOR FACULTY DEVELOPMENT Workshop Leader: Jennifer Takagishi, University of South Florida

#### **Objectives:**

Describe how peer mentorship differs from traditional mentoring relationships Analyze the functions of peer mentoring relationships at different career stages Develop a peer mentorship model for your institution

Mentorship is a key element for the career advancement of academic pediatricians. However, the traditional dyad of a senior and junior faculty pairing may be insufficient for several reasons, including the need for more than one mentor by most, and varying expectations and goals for the relationship. In addition, one-on-one relationships may be quite time-consuming, short-lasting, and may not fulfill some mentee needs such as work-life balance guidance. In addition, traditional dyad mentoring relationships are potentially

problematic because of the inherent power differential existing between senior faculty mentors and mentees. Peer mentorship is another model that has been described in the literature as a means to provide mentoring opportunities, particularly for junior faculty. These relationships usually occur between faculty in similar career stages learning together and sharing collective experiences. The value of peer mentoring may be of increasing significance in the career development of pediatric faculty as means of fulfilling the needs noted above. Through a series of video clips, we will explore the differences between traditional mentorship, peer mentorship and friendship relationships. Via a brief literature review followed by interactive breakout sessions, we will also discuss innovative ways to develop peer mentoring opportunities and explore how these relationships may prove cost- and time-effective in an era of shrinking faculty development dollars. Participants will be invited to share their experiences with peer mentoring and workshop leaders will highlight other successful examples. Finally, we will consider how peer mentorship may evolve throughout one's career, as needs for learning new skills, work-life balance and promotion mature.
